  1. **In Response to the Declaration of Purpose** for CA. LAW SB634  
“ensuring a compassionate, evidence-based approach to ending homelessness,”
  2. **To Restore Compassion in protecting and serving ALL of Shasta Co. Citizens**
2. **To be Comprised of representatives of diverse perspectives:**
  - a. Elected Municipal Administrative Representatives
  - b. Emergency Housing & Shelter Stake-Holders
  - c. Non-Profit Proposal to fill gaps in Homeless Services.
  - d. Non-Profit Investigative Legal Oversight Advocates
  - e. Homeless Advocates
  - f. Camping & Street Homeless Majority Population, Past and Present
  - g. “Conservative” Public advocate
  - h. “Progressive” Public Advocate

With open meetings for public input
3. **To Review the intent** of the **New California Law SB634** to \*recognize and correct harmful “policy failures,” \*recognize and correct “excessive penalties” for some “disproportionately” represented and underserved homeless, \*remove barriers to individual efforts to improve their condition, \* make appropriate housing more available and affordable.
3. **To Compare Local Ordinances and Policies** to the new CA.LAW SB634 considering both the reasoning and unintended consequences of those policies regarding the well-being of both the public and camping/street homeless.
4. **To Consider Enforcement** of local Ordinances and Policies in current practice, as reported by the homeless and observers, since the **January 2025**, when SB634 was to be activated.
5. **To Recommend the Replacement of Harmful Policies for Helpful ones** that would bring local law enforcement practices into compliance with CA. SB634 to protect the well-being of the public and homeless alike while contributing to the end of the homeless crisis.
6. **To Consider and Recommend** the most cost effective and collaborative “affordable housing,” for the “disproportionately” represented homeless group, suffering “excessive penalties” for their unasked for condition.
7. **To Continue monitoring** Redding & Shasta Co.’s compliance to CA Law 634, to avoid costly legal consequences for non-compliance.
